


## WES PTO

## From Your Energy Advocate

Happy New Year! And welcome to a new mini-series, *Why Electrify?*, where we'll take a practical look at why building electrification matters, how it works, and what incentives and programs can help offset the cost of making the switch. This month we're starting with the fundamentals: what can you electrify in your home today? Most people are familiar with heat pumps for space heating and cooling and with electric vehicles. But home electrification extends much further. Technologies like heat pump water heaters, induction cooking, and electric clothes dryers are proven, commercially available, and often more efficient and controllable than their fossil-fueled counterparts. You can even electrify your yard equipment! ## From Your Stewardship Committee

As we turn the page on the calendar and step into a new year, we're offered a wonderful opportunity to reflect, reset, and recommit ourselves to living as faithful stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. Stewardship is about more than finances — it encompasses every aspect of our lives: our time, talents, treasures, and the care we show for God's creation.

2. **Build an Emergency Fund:** Responsible stewardship includes planning for unexpected expenses. 
3. **Reduce Debt:** If you're carrying debt, consider making a plan to reduce it this year. Financial freedom allows for more generous giving.

Faithful stewardship is a spiritual practice. It's not just a tactical effort but one that should be nurtured through other spiritual disciplines, like prayer.






#### I've Got a Secret! January Soup and Salad
